The **Hydro corridor dog park** decision has been made with **choice B as the preferred site**. That will be on the section between Klondike and Whernside Terrace. Expect to see work begin in the spring.

Some disappointing news for our friends in **Beaverbrook and Kanata Lakes** with the decision on development of the golf course lands. A setback, yes, but the efforts will continue with help from the City of Ottawa and private donations. Show your support by visiting the **Kanata Greenspace Protection Coalition**.

Klondike Road will be closing around November 1 for six weeks from March to Sandhill for underground piping work. Signs and detours directions will be posted. Drive safely, as always.

Drain the swamp! That's been done recently at the **Statewood and Terry Fox stormwater pond** as anyone can smell and see. The latest update is to do another treatment of herbicide spraying to kill off the invasive phragmites (tall reeds) in the lower section, and a geotechnical investigation (digging a hole) on the upper section using a drill rig to find the cause of the leaking (holes in the wall). We're hoping they will clear out the cattails and overgrowth while it's empty. Stay tuned for further exciting developments!

The **BMGCA Annual General Meeting** (AGM) will be taking place November 30th. The meeting will be open to all paid members who will be able to ask a question and to vote. Eco-Harvest Celebration: Thank a Pollinator! A bright, sunny sky and gentle, cool breeze were the backdrop for a fun Eco-Harvest Celebration: Thank a Pollinator! Event. Our shared event with the Kanata Muslim Association on September 30th brought out many environmentally conscious people. From opportunities to buy organic produce grown on regenerative farms, to native plants direct from a local grower, event goers had lots of choices. Experts were on hand to share tips on creating pollinator gardens from seed at home. Along with lots of other activities, kids painted rocks to display at our new pollinator patch. There was something for everyone to enjoy. Our own Kanata North Regeneration Stewards were available to share details about this summer's corridor restoration projects, including the new 550 sq. ft. Kanata North Pollinator Patch near Abbeydale Circle. This special garden contains twenty-four species of Ontario native plants to support diverse pollinators with vibrant, blooming flowers from April through October. It also serves as a colourful site for educational events and nature photographers. Lw

Our former Kanata North Corridor Caretakers have changed the name of their volunteer crew to Kanata North Regeneration Stewards (KN RegenS for short), to more accurately reflect the work they do and people they are: The Kanata North Regeneration Stewards are a team of multiethnic, multiracial, intergenerational, and neurodiverse volunteers with the goal of restoring biodiversity, while bridging connections that improve our community's social and ecological wellbeing through community-led stewardship.

A Safety Tip

The snow season is here. Right now, is the time to get your car ready with a good battery and good snow tires. Make an emergency car kit-use a camping cooler with a lid, and fill with a blanket, spare hats and gloves or mitts, a flashlight, can of Puncture Seal, first aid kit, a few energy bars, and a bottle of water. Also keep a good small snow shovel and bag of salt. A spare jug of windshield washer. Keep your mobile phone fully charged and the fuel tank full, or almost. Before driving, do a walkaround of your car and make sure all lights, mirrors and windows are clear of snow or ice. **Set the headlight switch to auto on** and confirm your rear lights are also on, then never touch the switch again. They turn off automatically. But wait, there's more! *Following a snowplow is always better than trying to pass one. *Parking overnight in your garage is so much better if you have one. *If you have a new vehicle, practice a few skids on snow in an empty parking lot. Happy winter.
